

## One Another: The Path Of Community | Honour One Another (Philippians 2:1-4; Romans 12:10)

- 1. Read Philippians 2:1-11 and Romans 12:3-13. Which words, phrases or concepts stand out to you? Why?
- 2. How might you have defined the idea of 'honouring one another' before hearing the message on Sunday? Can you think of some examples of when your understanding of 'honour' has been on display?
- 3. Have you had experience of 'honouring one another' in a different cultural setting or country? How did this practice align or differ from that described in our Scripture verses? Are their practices you would like seen in our UK context?
- 4. What, do you think, makes another person worthy of honour? Biblically, who should we honour, why and is this always easy?
- 5. Do you agree that we live in a 'selfie society'? How have you seen this to be true or untrue?
- 6. How do the Apostle Paul and William Temple similarly define humility? How does Jesus model a sound definition of humility? Chris stated that Jesus models service and sacrifice, yet he was the name above every other name.
- 7. How does Philippians 2:1-11 challenge our church with the example of Christ? Do we have room for growth?
- 8. What does it mean for a church to be like-minded (v2)? What is the link between like-mindedness and joy (v2)?
- 9. Can you think of a contemporary example of King Saul's pride towards David? If King Saul had grasped the concept of 'honouring one another' in a Christ-like manner, what might his response have been like?
- 10. As we continue our journey through the Covid pandemic, what practical ways can we fulfil the command of Scripture to honour one another? Do you have any concerns about the practicalities of returning to church after 19 July given the Covid challenge?
- 11. Spend some time praying for each other that each person will become even more like Jesus. Use the words of Romans 12 and Philippians 2 to inspire your prayer.
