

The Father Heart Of God | Rejoicing In Family | Ephesians 4:1-16

- 1. Share something of the joys and the challenges of being a family.
- 2. Why do you think the Father's heart rejoices when there is a new birth into His family? Why is it so significant and important to Him, and what are the implications for us as a Church family? Luke 15:6-7, 8-10 & 32
- 3. 'You can be a perfectly good Christian without bothering with Church'. How would Paul answer this in the light of Eph. 4:1f
- 4. What are the characteristics that Paul mentions that the Father's family are to embrace and put on? Compare with Colossians 3:12-15 How do they help to build and maintain healthy relationships and unity? Do you consciously give attention to them in your life and relationships?
- What doctrinal truth is Paul stating and emphasising in Eph.4:4 6?
 Discuss what each aspect means and their importance in relation to what Paul says in v14.
- 6. Discuss the comment: 'Some people think of the Church as a pyramid with the pastor at the top. Others think of the Church as a bus being driven by the pastor who takes passive passengers where they should go. God wants us to see the Church as a Body or Family where every part does it share'.
- 7. Eph. 4:7 'But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it.' A definition of apportioned is to divide or share according to a plan. From what Paul says, what is God's plan in the apportioning of Jesus gifts to the Church family?
- 8. Read 1Peter 4:10 Do you recognise Jesus' grace gifts being used within CBC? Have you recognised what gift/gifts Jesus has given you to share and serve?
- 9. What according to Paul's teaching are the distinctive hall-marks of maturity in the Church family? Is this maturity related to the age of family members or not?
- 10. Whose responsibility is it to ensure that the members of the Church family are as stated in v13' become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ'?
- 11. Pray for our CBC family to deepen our expression of 'living a life worthy of the calling we have received'.
