

Confidence In Character | Isaiah 39:1-8

- 1. Read either Isaiah chapters 35 or 40. What words of hope stand out. Do these words give you hope in a world that is so uncertain?
- 2. Remind yourselves of all that God had provided and accomplished through Hezekiah in chapters 36-39. Isaiah is reminding us of all that God provides in times of conflict, critical illness and tests of character.
- 3. The envoy from Babylon comes to flatter Hezekiah. Consider other Biblical Characters who in the light of all that God had provided were tested in their faithfulness.
- 4. What does Hezekiah's reaction to the Babylonian envoy say about his character?
- 5. Why did Hezekiah show the envoys all his possessions? What could he have done instead? What was God expecting him to do?
- 6. What are your thoughts regarding the way that Hezekiah responded to Isaiah's prophecy? How would you react if a fellow Christian lovingly challenged your behaviour?
- 7. Isaiah is showing us that despite King Hezekiah's good reputation he was still flawed. Read Isaiah 53 to consider Isaiah's prophecy of true kingship expressed in servanthood.
- 8. Spend time asking the Holy Spirit to fill you with the Fruit of the Spirit from Galatians 5:22 to reflect Christ's character in all you do.
