

Confidence In Crisis | Daniel 3:13-30

- 1. What impacted on you from the sermon that was shared on Sunday? How did it make you think? What decisions did you make from your reflections?
- 2. Read Daniel 3:13-30 together, what stands out to you in this account? What do you notice and what is the significance to you?
- 3. V13-18: there was a point of crisis. In verses 16-18 we see how the three friends responded to crisis? What do you see of their character in their response? From your own experience, what have you learnt about how to face a crisis as a Christian.
- 4. V19-27: a moment of deliverance. How did this deliverance look from the perspective of those involved. What did look like from the perspective of Nebuchadnezzar? What did it look like for Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego? Do you think this what was expected?
- 5. On Sunday it was said 'it is in our greatest suffering that we can know the manifest presence of God all the more.' Do you agree or disagree with this statement? What comes to mind for you as you consider it?
- 6. V28-30: an act of worship. When you hear someone share about how God has acted for them, how does it affect you? What you notice in yourself and in the church community when someone testifies to what the Lord has done?
- 7. Share and encourage one another with any recent stories of where you have noticed God's activity. Allow the sharing to turn naturally into a time of thanking God and worshiping him.
- 8. 1 Thessalonians 5:24 says 'The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do it.' What will the Lord do?
- 9. How can you have confidence in crisis?
