



Crossing Into God's Promise | Joshua 3:1-17

1. What are some of the most important promises you've made? When in your life have you found it easy or difficult to keep to those promises?
2. Is God bringing something new into your life right now? What is he doing? Where can you see him most at work? Do you find this exciting, challenging, or a mixture of many things?
3. God commanded the Israelites to wait at the Jordan for three days before crossing over. Why do you think that is? What do you think about the idea that it was to show the Israelites that they couldn't cross without God's grace? Exposing our weaknesses and failures may not seem like a loving thing for God to do, but why is this sometimes necessary?
4. When has God brought you to 'the Jordan'? When has he needed to reveal or remind you of your need of him? What was the result of this work in your life? Has this changed how you view God, yourself or your circumstances?
5. How easy or difficult are you finding it to trust God at the moment? Share together an area of your life that you are needing to trust God more.
6. Where have you seen God remaining faithful to his promises recently? How have you seen his faithfulness over your life recently? How does this encourage you to trust God for the future?
7. "God often opens his hand one finger at a time." (Alexander MacLaren). Why do you think God does this? Can you see God doing this in your life right now?
8. As a follower of Jesus, you have been blessed with every spiritual blessing in Christ. What does that mean to you? How does that influence the way you live your day-to-day in your own life?
9. As a follower of Jesus, you have inherited more than Canaan, you have inherited Christ and all the blessings and promises that come with him! What is one of those blessings that you find most meaningful, encouraging or precious for where you're at at the moment?
