



Together On The Road | Nehemiah 2:11-20

1. Read the passage again together. What strikes you as you read?
2. What do you think 'adventure' looks like for you individually at the moment, and for us as a church community?
3. Nehemiah did careful research. Who are the people who you are in contact with in your everyday life? How much do you know about their lives? How much do you know about our area?
4. It was very important that everyone shared in building the walls. Read Romans 12:6-8, 1 Corinthians 12:4-11 and 1 Corinthians 12:12-31. What gifts do you think you bring to this adventure together? If it is difficult to say for yourself, share what you see in each other.
5. The people building the walls faced opposition. What are the risks as we set out on our adventure together? Where might disunity come from? Are there other risks or sources of opposition which we might need to be alert for?
6. In what ways can we encourage each other when difficult times come? It is easy to think we all need the same things, but we are all different! Share the things you each need when life is tough.
7. What is our challenge once the building is open? What do you think of the idea of 'holy discontent'?
8. Share what is on each of your hearts and spend some time praying for each other.
