

Of First Importance: Dead & Buried (1 Corinthians 15:1-11)

- 1. What would you say are the essential elements of the gospel? Why is it so important to Paul that we hold on to these things?
- 2. Share the moment when you understood the gospel, that 'Jesus died for our sin'. How would you explain this to someone who had no previous knowledge of Christianity?
- 3. How would you define 'sin'? Do you think sin is a helpful word to use today?
- 4. 'Christ died for our sin.' Why did Jesus have to suffer and die so we could receive forgiveness and reconciliation with God?
- 5. Read Isaiah 53, one of the servant songs, a prophecy of the Messiah's suffering and death. How does it speak of God's sovereign plan and how does this help to make sense of Jesus death?
- 6. Read Psalm 103:12 and 1 John 1:9. How does it feel to know that your sins have been forgiven, regardless of how unforgiveable they may seem to you?
- 7. What difference does your belief that God has forgiven your sins make to your life both on a grand scale and on a daily basis?
- 8. In verses 9-11, what does it mean for you to be defined by God's grace?
- 9. Spend some time in worship and thanks to God for all Jesus has done for us, for the 'beautiful exchange' Paul speaks of in 2 Corinthians 5:21.
