Adult church is invited to come have a look at the creations after the second service!

The children will be wearing green clothing and accessories from their wardrobes, borrowed or from charity shops and thinking about the environmental disaster of fast fashion. Please encourage them to wear as much green as possible. During the service, the older children and young people will be going on a **litter pick** around the local community.
