



Called To Adventure | Genesis 12:1-9

1. When you hear the word "adventure" in relation to faith, what excites you and what makes you uncomfortable? Where do you think people most often struggle with faith: starting, waiting, not understanding what God is doing or something else?
2. What stands out to you when you read Genesis 12:1-9? What questions might Abraham have had that the text does not answer?
3. Chris reminded us that Abraham was not a spiritual hero when God called him. Why do you think God so often calls people before they feel ready? What does it look like to be honest about where you are with God right now, without pretending or minimising your struggles?
4. Are there ways Christians sometimes pressure themselves (or others) to "be further along" than they really are? Where do you sense God meeting you as you are, rather than where you think you should be?
5. Abraham's journey unfolded over decades and included failure, waiting, and doubt. Which part of Abraham's journey do you most relate to right now: leaving, waiting, failing, or trusting again? Why do you think waiting is such a powerful (and difficult) tool God uses to grow faith?
6. Chris highlighted Abraham's attempt to "help God out." In what ways are we tempted to rush God's timing in our own lives? What might a next faithful step look like for you, rather than a giant leap?
7. "When God doesn't make sense, He is often doing deep work in us." How have you seen faith grow through uncertainty rather than clarity? What is the difference between trusting God and understanding God?
8. Abraham eventually trusted God even when it cost him deeply (Genesis 22). What do you think enabled Abraham to say "yes" at that stage of his journey? Where might God be inviting you to trust Him without having all the answers?
9. What makes it hardest for you personally to say "yes" to God? How can this group support one another in taking faithful steps-especially when life feels unclear? If faith is a journey rather than a destination, what encouragement does that give you today?
