

Grace To Grow | Romans 6:1-18

- 1. Looking back over the "Amazing Grace" series, which aspect of grace has impacted you the most-grace defined, transforming grace, grace in weakness, grace for forgiveness, or grace to grow? Why? When you hear the word 'growth' in the Christian life, what emotions come up for you-pressure, hope, discouragement, excitement? Share why.
- 2. Paul asks, "Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase?" What misunderstandings of grace do you think Paul is confronting here? Chris said, "Grace is not an excuse to remain as we are; it is the power to become who we were meant to be." How does that challenge or encourage your current view of spiritual growth?
- 3. In what ways do you see "spiritual stagnation" as dangerous rather than neutral? Where do you personally feel the temptation to stagnate? Romans 6 emphasises that we have been united with Christ in His death and resurrection. How does this reshape the way you think about becoming more like Jesus?
- 4. "You are the new you, made alive in Christ, learning to live out what is already true."
 What does this mean practically in your daily life? Where do you still tend to live as if the "old you" is in charge? Paul commands us to "count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God." What would it look like to actively "reckon this true" in moments of temptation or shame?
- 5. Which of the three life applications from the sermon (temptation, past shame, slow growth) speaks most to your current season? Why? Paul says, "Do not let sin reign, but present yourselves to God." What are the everyday choices where you feel this battle most clearly?
- 6. In which area do you most need grace-empowered intentionality this week? What comfort do you take from the promise: "Sin shall not be your master, for you are under grace"?
- 7. Paul describes Christians as moving from slavery to sin to becoming "slaves of righteousness." How does this metaphor challenge our modern view of freedom? Where do you sense God inviting you into deeper obedience-not as pressure, but as freedom under a new Master?
- 8. Chris said: "Growth is not a moment-it's a journey...grace guarantees progress, not perfection." What small evidences of growth (however subtle) can you thank God for right now?



What did you discover about God in this passage? What did you discover about people in this passage? How will you commit to obey this passage this week? With whom will you share what you have learned?
