

## Confidence In Confession | Romans 10:1-15

Verse 1-2: What does Paul express as his heart's desire and prayer for the Israelites? How does this reflect his passion for evangelism? What does Paul say about the zeal of the Israelites? How can zeal without knowledge impact one's faith and evangelism efforts?

Verse 3-5: What is the consequence of seeking to establish one's own righteousness instead of submitting to God's righteousness? How does this relate to the message of the gospel? How does Paul describe Christ in relation to the law? What does this mean for the message we share in evangelism? What does Paul say about the righteousness that is based on the law? How does this compare to the righteousness based on faith?

Verse 6-8: How does Paul explain the righteousness based on faith using the metaphor of bringing Christ down or up from the dead? What does this imply about the accessibility of the gospel message?

Verse 9-10: What are the two key actions mentioned by Paul that lead to salvation? How do these actions encompass the essence of evangelism? According to Paul, how do belief and confession work together in the process of salvation? How can we incorporate this understanding into our evangelistic efforts?

Verse 11-12: What promise is given to those who believe in Christ? How can this assurance motivate us in sharing the gospel? How does Paul emphasize the universality of the gospel in this verse? What implications does this have for our approach to evangelism?

Verse 13-15: What does Paul say about who can be saved? How does this encourage us to evangelize to all people? What questions does Paul ask to highlight the necessity of preaching for people to believe? How do these questions challenge us to take action in evangelism? What does Paul say about those who bring the good news? How does this verse inspire you to participate in sharing the gospel?

- 1. How can we make the gospel message clear and accessible to those around us?
- 2. What are some barriers we face in confessing Jesus as Lord publicly, and how can we overcome them?
- 3. How can we actively participate in the chain of evangelism described in verses 14-15 (sending, preaching, hearing, believing)?
- 4. What does it mean to have "beautiful feet" in the context of evangelism, and how can we cultivate this in our lives?
